
## **Evacuation shelters & evacuation sites**



Fukuoka City has designated the following evacuation shelters and evacuation sites to be used in a disaster.

## **Evacuation shelters**

Evacuation shelters are facilities for accommodating evacuees when they need to evacuate and/or are unable to live in their home due to a disaster.

• Temporary evacuation shelters: Facilities that can accommodate at least 50 people, such as a public hall

• Accommodation shelters: Facilities that can accommodate at least 100 people, such as an elementary or junior high school

Based on the disaster situation, damage to facilities, and conditions around the facilities, only those facilities that are deemed safe are opened as shelters.

## **Evacuation sites**

Evacuation sites are places designated with the intention of avoiding dangers of building collapse or fires due to disasters.

• District evacuation sites: Playgrounds of elementary and junior high schools, parks, etc.

• Wide-area evacuation sites: Large parks, etc.

(Wide-area evacuation sites are designated from among district evacuation sites.)

When all evacuees cannot be accommodated in the designated evacuation shelters alone, or when some of the designated evacuation shelters are unavailable due to the disaster situation, other public facilities, communities' meeting places and parks, in which tents can be set up, may be used as ad-hoc

evacuation shelters. Please pay attention to information in times of disaster.

Evacuation shelters which are marked with are equipped with an AED.
